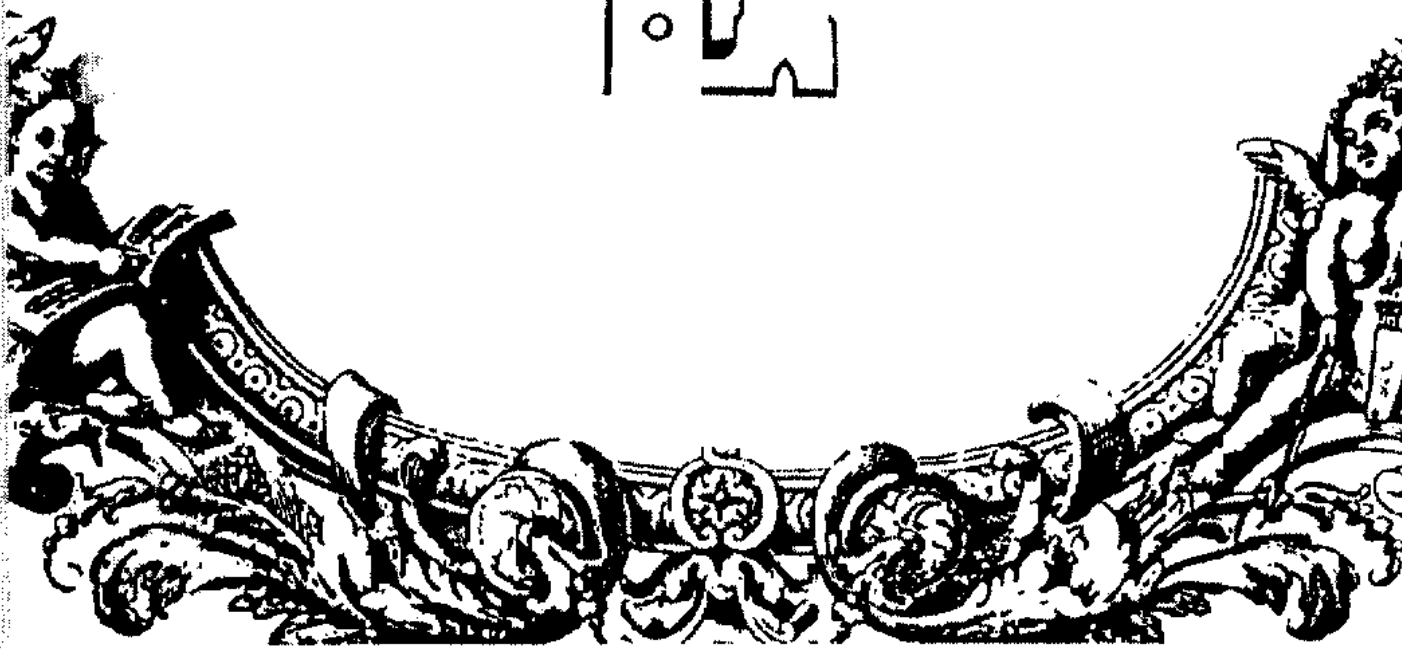

ELIZABETH HARLEY was born in Edinburgh, then studied singing privately in Glasgow, before coming south in 1983 to the Guildhall School of Music and Drama in London, as a post-graduate student.

She studies at present with Johanna Peters, and is a student on the opera course. She has sung for choral societies throughout Britain, and gave a memorable performance of Elgar's 'Sea Pictures' last autumn here in St. Saviour's, Guildford.

PENELOPE MITCHELL began clarinet lessons at the age of nine at school in Bedford. In 1975 she won a Junior Exhibition to the Royal College of Music where she studied for three years. Penelope was then offered a place at the Royal Academy of Music and studied clarinet there with John Davies F.R.A.M.

In 1980 Penelope reached the finals of the Toddington Haydn Memorial Festival and she has played in many recitals in Bedfordshire and London, both as a solo performer and with an Academy Trio. She now teaches music at Guildford High School.

TIMOTHY VENVELL was born in Oxford, took a degree in music while holding an organ scholarship at St. Catharine's College, Cambridge, before coming to Guildford in 1981 as Assistant Director of Music at the Royal Grammar School. Shortly after his arrival in Guildford he took over as organist and choir-master here at St. Saviour's, and then started up the Chantry Singers towards the end of his second year.
